### Handwriting

We are proudly a 'Structured Literacy' school, which basically means we follow effective research and best practice to teach our tamariki how to read and write. Structured Literacy, among other things, has a strong focus on phonological awareness and understanding how letters/sounds come together to make words and sentences.

This year, we are also focusing on the specifics of the teaching of handwriting. Forming letters correctly and developing a fluent style of handwriting, supports our tamariki to understand the formation, name and sound of letters. Fluent handwriting also allows children to write more freely, without the constraints of not knowing how to form letters. Handwriting also supports the development of children's fine motor skills, which helps with a range of many other skills.

## What fees do I need to pay at Central Normal School?

This year, our School Board have again opted into the Government School Donation Scheme. This means, rather than asking parents to pay a school donation, the government provides us with additional funding to provide opportunities for our tamariki, such as trips, activities and excellent resources.

**HOWEVER**, this does not extend to Sports Fees. If you would like your child to play sport for our kura, **parents must pay the sport fee.** Sports Fees go directly to the governing sport, such as Netball or Basketball and not to our school.
