# **Structured Literacy**

Recently in our pānui, we made mention about how our school uses a Structured Literacy approach to the teaching and learning of reading and writing in our kura. Yesterday, we had 4 kaiako from Greytown School visiting our kura to understand how we implement Structured Literacy across our school.

The photo to the right shows how it all begins. This is Victor's learning in Akomanga 8, showing the first letters and sounds that we teach, ka mau te wehi, Victor!

With these initial letters and sounds, tamariki are then able to learn the words that are made from these sounds, which begins the process of phonological awareness and decoding text.

# Hāngi

On Thursday 29 June, we are planning to have a school hāngi to celebrate Matariki (NB: Matariki falls within the school holidays). To help us with the hāngi, we ask that each tamaiti brings in a vegetable, such as potato, kumara or cabbage (please, no pumpkin).
