

Every School Day is a BIG Day. This is a slogan from the Ministry of Education highlighting the importance of attendance at school. Regular and ongoing attendance at school is critical for well-being and achievement success. It also supports with routine, structure and social development. Obviously, there are genuine reasons to be absent from kura, such as sickness, medical appointments or tangihanga (funeral). If your child is going to be away from school, **please** let us know and the **reason** why they are absent.

All absences are recorded against a Ministry of Education code. For example, if a child is absent because they are sick - this is an Explained and Justified absence. If a child was to be absent due to being on holiday overseas, this is an Explained but Unjustified Absence - that is, it's Explained because you have let us know, but it is Unjustified as it's a holiday during school time.

If we don't hear from you and we can't get hold of you, your child will be marked as **Truant**. Therefore, it is really important that you let us know when and why your child is going to be absent from school.
