Whakamahana

This weeks Whakamahana is a word association game, to build fluency and confidence with speaking reo. Think of a kaupapa for the game, such as: whānau. The first person begins by saying a word, such as, 'he mokopuna'. The next person thinks of a word associated with mokopuna, eg: kuia. They then must say the first word and then their word, eg: "he mokopuna, he kuia". The third person thinks of a word, eg: koro and must say all the words, eg: he mokopuna, he kuia, he koro. The game continues until you can't think of anymore! Change the game by changing the kaupapa, eg: kai, transport, papatuanuku.
